Dear Cousins,

As we enter the Thanksgiving season, we are again made aware of all our many blessings this past year. What an incredible time it has been for our **HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY**. With plenty of teamwork by all the Cousins - much is being accomplished as each month passes.

### NATIONAL HISTORIC DISTRICT:

As we told you in the 1991 NOVEMBER NEWSLETTER, the entire area surrounding the intersection of State Route #547 and Sandhill Road - known as **HUNT'S CORNERS** - is being considered for nomination as a NATIONAL HISTORIC DISTRICT. This includes the **HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH** (now our **HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY**) plus **HEYMANN HOUSE BED & BREAKFAST** - the former home of **ELIZABETH (LIBBIE) HARTMAN** and **LOUIS PHILIP HEYMAN**. **SHARI L. BOWERS** gave us an update on the progress of the committee during the annual September 1992 Board Meeting. Things continue to look very favorable - and after the State of Ohio in Columbus concludes their portion of the work - probably in December 1992 - then the plan will be submitted to Washington, D.C. for their final approval. It looks quite promising - and is very exciting for all the Cousins. I'm sure our ancestors would be most pleased at the efforts on this project.

### CHURCH IMPROVEMENTS:

This year after bids were submitted, our **CHURCH** is now sporting a much-needed new coat of white paint. The last time the **CHURCH** was painted was in 1983 ... so it was definitely overdue. Now it looks fresh and clean again ... and beautiful!

### MEMORIAL ARBORETUM IMPROVEMENTS:

Some new commemorative trees have recently been planted in the new **MEMORIAL ARBORETUM** in honor of relatives.

A plaque was put in place during the dedication of the Flowering Crab Apple tree donated on the occasion of the 50th Golden Wedding Anniversary of **VIOLET** and **MELVIN HERNER** (page 216) of Bellevue, Ohio by their three daughters and spouses, **RITA & THOMAS BOALS**, Boise, Idaho; **NANCY & FRANK OSBORN**, Bellevue, Ohio and **BONNIE & DR. DUANE PETERSON**, of Erie, Michigan.

On August 2, 1992 the grandchildren of **PHILIP AUGUST ZISS** (pages 18-23) took part in the dedication of their plaque for a Norway Maple tree planted in his memory. During their third annual **ZISS REUNION** in 1991 they all contributed \$300.00 towards the purchase of a tree and plaque in his honor.

Our thanks to each of you for adding to the beauty of the property surrounding the **CHURCH** - while also remembering your loved ones with such a lovely memorial. Your endeavors will give much enjoyment to many people in the years ahead.

A new Park Bench has been provided for your pleasure by **JACKIE** and **DAVID HYMAN** and their children, in honor of his father, **JUDGE HARVEY EUGENE HYMAN** of Paulding, Ohio. Now you can sit down and rest a little, while visiting the **CHURCH** and the **MEMORIAL ARBORETUM**.

**PROFILE OF A BOARD MEMBER:**

This year we were privileged to have Board Member **RUDOLF WAGNER**, our Continental Affairs Chairman, join us for our annual Board Meeting from his home in Dauborn, Germany. We were also pleased to meet one of **RUDOLF'S** sons-in-law, **KLAUS KERN**, the husband of his second daughter **ELKE**. **KLAUS** is a supervisor of computer programers for the R+V Versicherung Company in Wiesbaden, Germany, and had been in Arizona for four weeks on business. A very nice young man.

**RUDOLF** has been employed at the Commerzbank in Limburg, Germany since 1956, and in 1980 was made manager there. He and his wife **ELLEN** make their home in Dauborn. **ELLEN** is the secretary at the family church in Kaltenholzhausen, where she has direct access to the old church books and can read the old German script - a very difficult feat.

**RUDOLF** and **ELLEN** are members of the Society for Nassau Area Archeology and History Search, which was founded in 1812 - and is the oldest Historical Society in Germany. With a gift of our 1973 **HEYMANN FAMILY HISTORY BOOK** - given to him by Board Member **ELDEN PLUE**, after the death of his mother, **FLORENCE M. PLUE**, we are hoping they will be better able to trace our family tree back even further than we have to date. We owe them a deep debt of graditude for their interest in helping us with this most worthwhile undertaking.

**RUDOLF** brought some excellent ideas to the Board Meeting, which he shared with the group. We are all looking forward to our next trip to Europe in September 1993 - when we will be holding our Board Meeting in the **CASTLE AT BURGSCHWALBACH**, Germany - a most fitting place for family continuity - as it was built by **HEYMANN'S** in the 15th Century!

**OTHER COUSINS FROM GERMANY VISIT THE USA:**

During the past year several of our former hosts during our first "COUSINS TRIP TO GERMANY" in May 1989, visited America for the second time. (Their first trip was in May 1990.)

In April 1992 **HILDE** and **WILLI SCHAFER**, the former Mayor of Kaltenholzhausen, along with **HANNELORE** and **THORWALD STARK**, both of Kaltenholzhausen, toured California, Florida and then took a cruise to Nassau, the capital of the Bahama Islands.

A few weeks later in April and May 1992, **ANNELORE** and **RUDOLF ALTENHOFEN** of Arzbach, Germany, visited Kansas for the first time. They then flew to Florida, followed by a trip to Ohio, before flying back to Germany from O'Hare International Airport in Chicago, Illinois.

We look forward to seeing all our Cousins again in Germany in September 1993, when we will again be visiting our "roots".

**MEET SOME OF YOUR COUSINS:**

As a continuing feature of your NEWSLETTER ... we are profiling three Cousins ... we think you should know a little better.

**OTTO KARL HEIMANN** of Huenfelden, Germany is the son of **WILHELMINE LOHR** and **AUGUST LUDWIG HEIMANN**. He was married to **MINA OHLENBURGER** in

1946, who passed away in 1968 after only 22 years of marriage. They were the parents of one son, **KLAUS DIETER HEIMANN**.

**OTTO** attended the Limburg, Germany School for Agriculture from 1933-1935, and served in the German Army at Montabaur, Germany from 1939-1941. He was engaged in farming from 1930-1978, and has been active in the family brandy distilling firm since 1930 to the present.

**OTTO** enjoys reading and travel and has visited the USA, Egypt and Hungary. He also remains an active gymnast, and participates in the annual German Gymnastics Festival each May. In 1990 he was honored by them on his 75th birthday for his many gymnastic feats.

During our May 1989 "COUSINS TRIP TO GERMANY", **OTTO** presented each one in the group of 81 with a gift of their own bottle of schnapps from their distillery, as a memento of our trip to Germany. On our upcoming second trip to Germany in September 1993, **OTTO** has agreed to give us all a tour of the family distillery. We will all look forward to that - and also seeing **OTTO** again. He has remained a staunch supporter of the **HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY** over the years.

**MARY FLORENE HYMAN** of Fort Wayne, Indiana was the sixth of eight children born to **OLLIE MAY HATTERY** and **HENRY PETER HYMAN** - and was the granddaughter of **CATHERINE KURTZ** and **PHILIP ADAM HEYMANN** who was born in Niederbachheim, Germany in 1829. (page 323) (**MARY'S** father dropped the **E** and **N** from his original **HEYMANN** name.)

**MARY** was a registered nurse and was also a retired Major from the Army Nurse's Corps. She served in World War II and spent four years in Germany. During the Korean Conflict she was stationed in Tokyo, Japan from 1950-1953.

While in Korea she also met another cousin, **JUDGE HARVEY EUGENE HYMAN** of Paulding, Ohio (page 320) who was then a First Lieutenant in the Counter Intelligence Corps in the Far East. They had not seen each other for 25 years - until they both joined the group of 81 on the first "COUSINS TRIP TO GERMANY" in May 1989. This trip was **MARY'S** 4th trip to Germany since her retirement in 1959.

Since her retirement **MARY** has spent her summers in Fort Wayne, Indiana and her winters in Venice, Florida, where she kept a beautiful yard of flowers, trees and shrubs, and in 1992 she planted a couple more orange trees there.

**MARY** has been an ardent supporter of the **HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY**, and in May 1989 she donated funds for the gifts that were to be presented to our host Cousins during the program held in their "Friendship Hall".

**JOSEPH SKELDON HEYMAN** of Perrysburg, Ohio, the eldest of six children born to **GERTRUDE F. SKELDON** and **HOMER FRANKLIN HEYMAN** (page 108), is an Attorney of Counsel with the prestigious law firm of **SPENGLER, NATHANSON, HEYMAN, MCCARTHY & DURFEE** in Toledo, Ohio. He received both his A.B. degree and J.D. degree from Ohio State University at Columbus. **JOE** is a member of the American, Ohio and Toledo Bar Associations, and served as president in 1963-1964. He has served as Attorney General of Ohio and as General Counsel at the University of Toledo.

**JOE** is also the Honorary Senior Counsel for the **HEYMANN HISTORICAL SOCIETY**. As such he was instrumental in making the Matching Funds grant possible in 1989, from the private foundation known as the **FRANCE STONE**

FOUNDATION. With the \$10,000. collected from the Cousins, the FRANCE STONE FOUNDATION gave us a matching \$10,000. which was to be invested to provide annual income to help maintain the HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH. We all owe JOE a tremendous debt of gratitude for all his help over the years.

JOE is married to VIRGINIA HOOD SELBY HEYMAN and they are the parents of two children - SALLY HEYMAN NELSEN of Owatonna, Minnesota and RICHARD SELBY HEYMAN of Cape Coral, Florida. VIRGINIA & JOE, plus their daughter SALLY and her husband RICHARD NELSEN and son RICHARD and his wife ROSALEE, were among the group of 81 on the first "COUSINS TRIP TO GERMANY" in May 1989 - along with JOE's sister, MARIE HEYMAN RACINE, of Cape Coral, Florida.

JOE also assisted cousin RUTH WHISLER GILPIN with the paper work involved in her recent contribution of stock to the HEYMAN HISTORICAL SOCIETY, in memory of her grandmother, ELIZA HEYMAN SMITH, and her mother, MARY SMITH WHISLER. The **JOHN GEORGE HEYMAN** Reunion was held at **HEYMAN HOUSE BED & BREAKFAST** near Monroeville, Ohio on Sunday, August 2, 1992, following Sunday services conducted by the **REVEREND GLENN COLEMAN**, Vermilion, Ohio in the former **HUNT'S CORNERS CHURCH** - now the **HEYMAN HISTORICAL SOCIETY**.

This was the 145th Anniversary of the arrival of **PHILIP WILLIAM HEYMAN** to the United States in 1847 ... the first **HEYMAN** to set foot on these shores. He crossed the Atlantic in a sailing ship to get here ... a trip that took 52 days!

It was also the Anniversary of **PHILIP'S** 170th birthday in 1822, and the 90th Anniversary of his death in 1902. It was the 75th Anniversary of those early **YEARLY** reunion plans back in 1917 ... plus the 100th birthday of **MAUDE MABLE MCKEE WARNER** of Bowling Green, Ohio, the last surviving grandchild of **PHILIP WILLIAM HEYMAN**. So there was much to celebrate this year at the Sunday, August 2, 1992 Reunion.
