Beautiful View Needs to be Preserved

Board Says Storm Windows Should be Replaced to Protect Stained Glass Windows in Hunt's Corners Church

Come to the 2007 Annual Meeting and Reunion and Join Our Campaign

Please plan on attending the Heymann Historical Society 2007 Annual Meeting, held in conjunction with the 90th Annual John George Heymann Reunion and view the stained glass windows and the newly replaced storm windows. The storm window replacement project is underway at press time, and is estimated to cost \$5,500.

Replacing the storm windows is another task that as a family we must complete so we can continue our tradition of gathering once a year and





celebrating our heritage in the Hunt's Corners Church. Please make the effort to join us; for inspiration see excerpt from the invitation to the 1940 reunion:

Some of you in the distance have said that it is a long trip and a hard pull. We admit this is true. But we must remember that when our forebears... they had no pleasant journey before them. They were forced to face the perils of sea in an ocean voyage of more than 30 days. But they were of stout hearts and strong determination and let nothing turn them from seeking a refuge in a land of freedom, peace and opportunity.

(From invitation dated April 27, 1940 signed by Dan Heyman, Jr., President and Ethel F. Heyman, Secretary. The letter also included an invitation to buy Supplement #1 to the Heymann Genealogy and History for 50¢.)

Winter Meeting

Heymann Historical Society March 11, 2007

The winter meeting was called to order at the home of Lou and Norma Zorn at 1:20 PM. Board members present were Lou Zorn, David Hyman, Kurt Heyman, William Seaman, Chase Heyman, Matthew Heyman, Duane Heyman, Carol Germond and William Heiman. Board members not present were Ulrike Gapp, Albert Horn Jr. and Elden Plue.

Minutes of the September 24, 2006 meeting were read by William Seaman. Three minor corrections were made and the minutes were accepted.

Kurt Heyman presented the treasurer's report. The Society's net worth is \$520,139 – the highest figure in six years. David Hyman moved to accept the report, Duane Heyman seconded the motion and said motion carried unanimously.

Old Business

Memorial Bricks

Four new orders have been received. The deadline for 2007's installation is June 30.

Storm Windows for Church

A bid to "remove and dispose all the storm windows on the church, scrape clean, prime and paint area behind the storm windows, install 8 new white frames and storm windows with bottom quarter sections which open with a screen" was discussed. Consensus was that replacement of the storm windows was essential to protecting the integrity of the stained glass windows. William Heiman moved to accept David Stang's bid. Chase Heyman seconded the motion, and the motion passed without dissent. The job is to be finished prior to the August 2007 annual meeting.

Newsletter

Reports due to Katy Sherlock by April 10, 2007. The next edition will push the purchase of the family history books. We also will have pictures of the need-to-be replaced storm windows. William will send Katy Sherlock an old school register of the Hunts Corners schoolhouse – some of our relatives are in the attendance book.

August Reunion

We're looking for ideas and activities, especially for the children. The annual meeting will be held on August 5, 2007 at the Friendship Hall lot and the date of the fall meeting is September 30, 2007 at Donna and William's home at Hunts Corners.

Gift Items

Jackie Hyman reports that nine of the new wooden churches have been sold. The 2006 Burgschwalbach plate was shown at the meeting. Jackie is making an effort to keep inventory at reasonable levels. The Heymann Coat of Arms has been reordered. Rachel (Hyman) Parrett volunteered to provide assistance in marketing the Genealogy and other items for sale offered by the HHS.

First organized on August 14, 1858 as the German Evangelical Reformed Church, the congregation moved into a newly built Hunt's Corners Church building in 1866. In 1982 the remaining members of the congregation transferred the deed to the Heymann Historical Society to allow for preservation of the building. On September 2, 1993 the Hunt's Corners district was added to the National Register of Historic Places by the National Park Service, United States Department of the Interior.

What Goes Around...

While in Europe this past summer, the cousins of the HHS were the recipients of many thoughtful gifts, gestures of kindness, and delicious German meals from our friends and family in Kaltenholzhausen and Burgschwalbach. However, one gift that was presented to our society actually originated with one of our own American relatives!

Our friend, tour director, and honorary cousin Karl Schlederer amazed us with his contribution to our collection of historic memorabilia when he donated a postcard dated July 10, 1900. The postcard, depicting Koln Cathedral, was sent by "Elisabeth" to Mr. Frank W. Heyman of Monroeville, Ohio! Karl's mother, who lives in Austria, collects old postcards and had come cross this particular one in a box of many. Recognizing the surname of the recipient, she gave it to her son who saved it for the Heymann Historical Society.

The transcription of the postcard appears below with the exception of several words which were difficult to decipher.

We reached here this A.M. from Berlin and are at the Dom Hotel the finest in the city. -Just across from this cathedral which was begun in the 13^{th} century. (Unknown name) did not make the Rhine trip today because it rained all day but we leave to-morrow A.M. for (unknown word) by steamer. It has rained every day for 14 days in Koln. I was in bed nearly all day with one of my awful headaches. (Unknown) is very well. I thought of Hannah while I was in this church. How she would enjoy it. (Unknown) a while this afternoon and saw quite a number of Americans. --- Elisabeth



The second portion of the map portrays the destruction of Kaltenbach by Swedish troops during the war, and the final portion illustrates the united village of Kaltenholzhausen after the inhabitants of Kaltenbach settled near Holzhausen.


